

Do you have any recommendations how to improve the course? If so, which ones?

- 3 hours were a bit long for listening to other people, although I woulnd't know how to make these course more interactive. Maybe just create more sessions that are shorter (although this then consumes much more time in total).
- I liked presentations about specific research projects much more than those about a general research agenda (or rough research ideas).
- If possible it would be great to include more sociologists and political scientists into next years course. Generally, I felt like psychologists were overrepresented. In terms of organisation, I think it would be beneficial to this course to have it split into 1,5 hours blocks per session. It was quite hard for me to stay focused during the last hour of the meeting, which is unfortunate for the person who presented last.
- Less specific insights into the research and maybe more a broader perspective on different topics in the disciplines then the specific research papers rather as examples
 - Sometimes the introduction of the people affiliated with/working at the different departments took quite long although this is interesting I would have rather heard more about the actual research and topics in the field. Sometimes lecturers already ran out of time in the middle of their presentation, which made the presentation a bit rushed and left out potentially interesting content. Also the readings were really specific and thus not always very helpful to get a good insight into the broader research field.

- The presentations were partially too detailed. Maybe the focus should instead be stronger on the abstract research questions and general methods that are employed. That way potential collarborations become more easily apparent. I find this to be especially true for topics in which I do not have prior expertise.
 - Furthermore, focusing on a more general outline of the conducted research might facilitate the time management of the course. At times I felt that having an additional break would have been fruitful especially with regard to more personal contacts with the researchers and among the students to discuss what was learned in smaller groups.
- There were a lot of talks by psychologists; maybe their could have been more talks by political scientists and sociologists.
- perhaps change the times. Listening to 4 presentations in one time slot is a lot. it may be better to change it to 6 time slots with two presentations each.
