

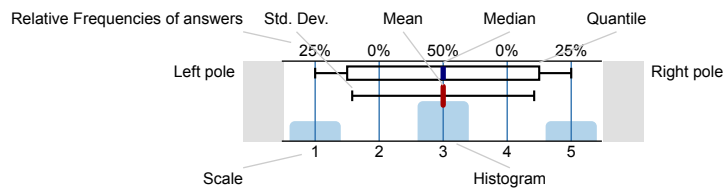

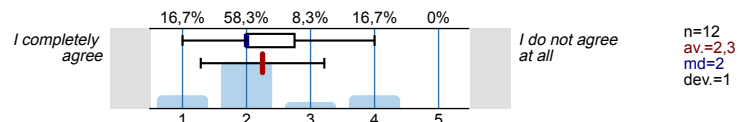

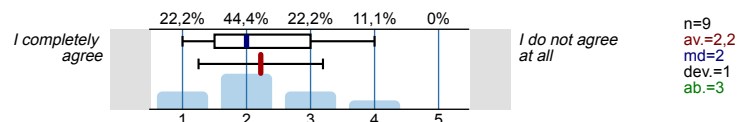

The course contents were illustrated very well by using appropriate examples.



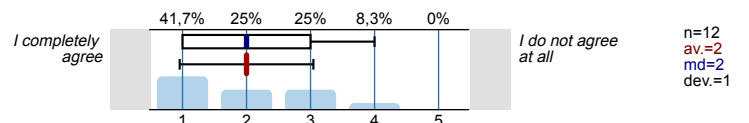

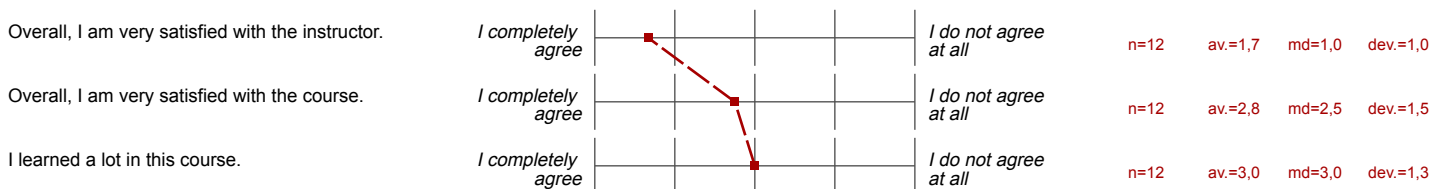

Overall satisfaction

What did you especially like about the course?

- - Forced me to think concretely about what I want to do
 - Insights into publication process
 - I learned, that often PhD students underestimate themselves...
- Highly interesting and inspiring presentations by members of faculty. The course helped me develop new research ideas and always nudged me to think outside the box. That especially applies to the regular discussions on how research from other fields might be useful for solving problems in our personal research.
- I appreciate the attempt at interdisciplinary exchange and the insight into what other departments/chairs are working on.
- New insights into research fields, that I had never heard of before & presentation of partly extremely interesting research findings & approaches.

Do you have any recommendations how to improve the course? If so, which ones?

- I did not find the assignment useful. Most of the presentation topics and methods were not at all relevant to my field of studies and thus, I was not able to generate a useful project proposal that I would actually be able to conduct at a later stage. I think the assignment for this class needs to be overworked, as it didn't really contribute to further knowledge and seems more like unnecessary busy work which considering how many assignments we already have is just an added stressor without much benefit.
- None, the course was great!
- Slightly amusing that we are always thought how important good time management is, when the number one thing that could be improved by most presenters was time management.
- Take concerns about mental health of students more serious - maybe recommend university internal or external support systems for people struggling.
- What I was missing was a bit more input about ethical considerations around the topics. While I am under the impression that some scientists do not view this as their major task I actually think that with this job comes a lot of responsibility. I would like to learn more about how "grown academics" deal with ethical questions that concern their research designs and research outcomes. I think this class would have been a good environment to actively engage us students in such discussions and for kicking off thought processes about ongoing ethical debates in a more structured way.
- While some presentations were interesting, I don't think this course is necessary or helpful for PhD students. Given the workload we already have in the first year, such a course is pointless and time-consuming for nothing.
