






The course contents were illustrated very well by using appropriate examples.








The instructor demonstrated a high level of commitment in this course.






What did you especially like about the course?

- - the manner in which exercises built up over time to lead to our proposal drafts
  - choice of topics: the topics reflected the move from student to researcher -> focus on publication, reviews, scientific conduct...
  - Thomas' encouragement based on personal experiences
- - topics were very important and new to me, so the structure and content of the course were really helpful
  - exercises to quickly present our topic
  - workshop day was helpful
- I liked the open atmosphere as well as the structure (what is a good research question? A good design? etc.).
- I like that I was forced to produce a first proposal, and think about specific RQs throughout the semester
- relevant aspects of research (e.g., FAIR principles, how to write a proposal, etc.) were covered; we also had the possibility to present and get feedback on our own work (and, feedback was also given by the instructor)
- There is one thing which I forgot to say today at the feedback meeting in class, which is that I really liked the external speaker sessions! Both sessions were helpful, the open science and the data management one (I didn't know about the services the uni also provides to PhD students, so I gained a lot of practical knowledge). Also, the session on the review process was super useful!


Do you have any recommendations how to improve the course? If so, which ones?

- - because it was discussed that our cohort is rather quiet: Maybe wait (even) longer for answers after asking a question; I can imagine that in our cohort people need some time to think about their answers (not because of being not-interested or not-well prepared, but maybe more due to personality traits); the 5-minute talk in the beginning idea is very good in my view
- I think every major criticism has also been voiced at the feedback meeting. Though there were many deadlines and the first ones started really early in the semester, I am convinced that the course was valuable - it definitely helped me to start thinking about my dissertation topic. The course provided a glimpse into different dimensions of academia (pitching ideas, peer reviewing, presentations, practical advice and connecting with fellow first years).
- I would do it more participatory. Especially in the last sessions, there was a lot of repetition on review etc., as well as a rather frontal teaching style, that did not help me much in my current phd process.
- set the workshop dates before the start of the course
- To me personally, the class was really driving and motivating. The quiet manner of the group was even apparent outside the class room - in light of that, I advice not to interpret it to strongly as a reflection on course design or teaching style.




